## WORM FARM CARE




### STARTING YOUR WORM FARM

1. Gather 2 buckets
2. Drill small holes all over the bottom and the lid of one bucket.
3. Mix ripped newspaper & a little bit of manure together in the bottom of the drilled bucket
4. Add a handful of worms
5. Add food scraps to feed the worms
6. Place a moist towel or hessian sack on top.

The bottom bucket is used to collect the 'worm wee'

If you run out of space in your top bucket, Grab another bucket put some holes in the bottom and stack it on top.

You can add rocks in the bottom to prop it up & make more space for the wee. Don't add liquid - food scraps have enough liquid to keep the system moist.



### WHY WORMS?

Worms take your scraps and produce an incredible fertiliser that is jam packed full of plant available nutrients. They are tough and breed very quickly.



### LOCATION

**Worm farms should never be in full sun as the worms will cook. In summer a shading spot under or on the south side of a property is ideal. In winter somewhere with morning sun is great.**



### WHAT TO FEED THEM

Worms will eat pretty much anything but there are a few things they don't love like garlic, onion & citrus peels.

You can feed them your compost bin and meal scraps and variety is key!



### HOW TO USE THE GOLD

Dilute the worm wee 1 part to 10 parts water and use as a liquid fertiliser on plants. The castings (their poo) can be used as a top dress for pot plants or general garden systems
